ABOUT THE 2024 FESTIVAL

The 2024 Elgar Festival is an examination of the origins of inspiration. Through concerts, talks, workshops and exhibitions, we'll illuminate the experiences that ignite the creative spark, to help audiences to understand better the creative process and to express their own creativity.

The artistic focal point of the '24 Festival is Elgar's Violin Concerto, one of his most autobiographical, confessional works. Building around this greatest of all violin concerti, we explore not only what inspired Elgar to write that work, but where he and other composers found their inspiration. Music inspired by friendship, love, pain and loss is contrasted with music inspired by place, events and even the music of the past.

Through two concerts by our English Symphony Orchestra, a family concert hosted by Esther Abrami and Julian Lloyd Webber featuring young performers, two relaxed concerts, choral events, chamber music concerts, youth courses for over 200 children, a public exhibition, lunchtime and late night events, and talks with leading musicians and composers, we celebrate the most diverse gamut of music with our community. 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KENNETH WOODS

Artistic Director

Hailed by Gramophone Magazine as 'a symphonic conductor of stature', American conductor Kenneth Woods was appointed Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of the English Symphony Orchestra in 2013, and has quickly built up an impressive and acclaimed body of work and recordings with them. Woods is also the Artistic Director of both the Colorado MahlerFest – the only US organisation other than the New York Philharmonic to receive the International Gustav Mahler Society's Gold Medal – and the Elgar Festival in Worcester.



Kenneth's fascination with the music of Elgar began when, as a young American cellist exploring music for his instrument, he stumbled upon Elgar's Cello Concerto. He has since become a passionate exponent of Elgar's music outside Britain, often bringing Elgar's works to audiences and orchestras whose knowledge of the composer was previously limited to a tiny



portion of his output. In 2015, Kenneth led the English Symphony Orchestra in the premiere of Donald Fraser's orchestration of the Elgar Piano Quintet, a concert Birmingham Post Critic Christopher Morley called '[One] of the most exciting events I have experienced during a reviewing career approaching half a century' declaring that Fraser's orchestration 'deserves to be acknowledged immediately as a worthy addition to the Elgar canon.' That performance was also singled out by Classical Music Magazine as 2015 Premiere of the Year, and the resulting recording on Avie Records was Classic FM Disc of the Month in May 2016. In 2022, Ken and the ESO released Elgar Reimagined in partnership with the Elgar Festival. Through it all, the Cello Concerto has remained a huge part of his musical life. Since discovering the work as a teenager, he's performed it as a soloist many times and conducted many more, perhaps most memorably when he had the honour of conducting the official 100th Annversary performance of the work with Raphael Wallfisch and the ESO in Worcester Cathedral at the 2019 Elgar Festival.

As a guest, Woods has conducted ensembles including the National Symphony Orchestra (Washington), Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, Cincinnati Symphony, BBC National Orchestra of Wales, Budapest Festival Orchestra, Royal Northern Sinfonia and the English Chamber Orchestra, and has made numerous broadcasts for BBC Radio 3, National Public Radio and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. He has appeared on the stages of some of the world's leading music festivals, such as Aspen, Scotia and Lucerne.



His discography of over thirty-five recordings includes numerous world premieres, and has received accolades including Gramophone Editor's Choice, the Diapaison d'Or and has appeared on Best of the Year lists in the Sunday Times, Gramophone, MusicWeb International, The Arts Desk, Forbes Magazine and NPR.

A widely read writer and frequent broadcaster, Woods' blog, A View from the Podium, is one of the 25 most popular classical blogs in the world. He has spoken on Mahler on NPR's All Things Considered and is a regular speaker on BBC radio programmes. Since 2014, he has been Honorary Patron of the Hans Gál Society.



ABOUT ESO, OUR ORCHESTRA-IN-RESIDENCE

Hailed as the International Orchestra of Elgar Country, the English Symphony Orchestra has a proud legacy of collaboration with leading Elgarians and major figures in British musical life including Yehudi Menuhin, Vernon Handley, Nigel Kennedy and Sir Michael Tippett. In recent years the orchestra has become synonymous with artistic excellence, innovative and visionary programming, distinctive commissioning, ground-breaking recording, a welcoming and immersive concert experience, transformative youth programmes and service to the community.

The orchestra's discography of over seventy recordings includes many works of Elgar. These recordings, and those of other major 20th century British composers, continue to appear on 'Best of the Year' listings in publications including The Times, Gramophone, Forbes and The Arts Desk. The orchestra has a commitment to the music of our time with particular affiliation to the works of Sir Michael Tippett, John Metcalfe, John Joubert, Michael and Lennox Berkeley, John McCabe, Philip Sawyers, David Matthews and Adrian Williams.

In 2017 the ESO under conductor Kenneth Woods launched the 21st Century Symphony Project, a multi-year endeavour to commission, premiere and record nine new symphonies by leading composers of our time.

The partnership with the Elgar Festival began in 2018 when the festival was established by decree of Worcester City Council as an annual event.





JULIAN LLOYD WEBBER

Festival Patron

In 2007, at the invitation of the Secretary of State for Education, Julian founded the UK Government's *In Harmony* programme, introducing the power of music to thousands of school children from the least privileged parts of England.

Julian was made a Fellow of the Royal College of Music in 1994 and is the recipient of a Crystal Award from the World Economic Forum (1998) the Classic FM Red Award (2005) and the Incorporated Society of Musicians' Distinguished Musician of the Year Award (2014). Julian has represented the music education sector on BBC1's Question Time and The Andrew Marr Show, BBC2's Newsnight, and BBC Radio 4's Today, The World at One, PM, Front Row and The World Tonight.

In 2014 Julian was forced to retire from playing the cello owing to a neck injury which reduced the power of his bowing arm. In July 2015 he was appointed principal of Birmingham Conservatoire. During his five-year tenure he oversaw the move to a new £57 million building and the merging of the existing Conservatoire with the Birmingham School of Acting. In September 2017 the Conservatoire was awarded the Royal status by Her Majesty the Queen.

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ESTHER ABRAMI

Artist-in-Residence

Esther Abrami is much more than a musician: she's an inspiration to a new generation of music enthusiasts.

Through her large social media platform, Esther shares her passion for music, performance and practice sessions and shares behind-the-scenes glimpses into her life as a musician with an evergrowing community worldwide. With her dazzling talent, infectious personality and boundless enthusiasm for music-making, Esther Abrami is a rising star and her new album Cinéma is not to be missed.

The 26-year-old violinist studied at the Royal College of Music and completed her master's degree at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, for which she received a full scholarship. In 2019, she became the first classical musician ever to win the 'Social Media Superstar' category at the Global Awards and in 2021 she was featured in Classic FM's '30 under 30 Classical Artists to Watch' series, curated by Julian Lloyd Webber and was listed as a 'Rising Star' by BBC Music Magazine. In 2021 she was signed to Sony Classical and made her Royal Albert Hall debut in 2022.

In the UK, Esther Abrami is considered one of the most promising young classical artists of her generation and has been appointed Creative Partner and Artist in Residence by the English Symphony Orchestra. With her debut album 'Esther Abrami' (2022) and an EP dedicated to women composers recorded with Her Ensemble,





a free-form group that seeks to address the gender gap and gender stereotypes in the music industry, Esther has become an artist who achieves wide attention outside the classical sphere. In her podcast 'Women in Classical', Esther Abrami regularly interviews outstanding women musicians and composers from the world of classical music with the hope of inspiring young people to pursue a career in music.

EDWARD ELGAR WELCOMES FEATURED COMPOSER STEVE ELCOCK





As an aspiring young composer growing up in 'Das Land ohne Musik' ('the land without music', as Britain was then known), I had to find my own way. I had to teach myself. Well, to be fair, my teachers were the scores of Beethoven, Wagner, Brahms and Bach, and my classroom was the orchestral rehearsal rooms of Herefordshire and Worcestershire, where I learned what did and didn't work. I'm proud to call myself a self-taught composer, and I'm always keen to celebrate my fellow autodidacts like Sir Michael Tippett and Philip Sawyers.

This year's Visiting Composer, Steve Elcock is another distinguished member of our brotherhood of the self-taught. Working on his own, completely outside of the music industry, Steve immersed himself in the scores of the great composers of the past and gradually developed one of the most original and powerful voices of his time. His is music of strength, conviction and beauty, and I'm delighted to have it sitting alongside my own works at this year's festival. I trust you will enjoy discovering his music as much as I have.





TALK: STEVE ELCOCK IN CONVERSATION

Edward Elgar is surely one of music's greatest autodidacts, an essentially self-taught composer who rose to become the greatest and most important British composer of all time. But

Elgar is not an isolated case – Sir Michael Tippett and Philip Sawyers are also fascinating examples of self-taught composers who have written some of the most compelling music of the last 100 years.

Steve Elcock is the Festival's featured composer for 2024 and the current John McCabe Composer-in-Association with the English Symphony Orchestra. Also self-taught, here in conversation with festival director Kenneth Woods, he shares his powerful story of finding his voice as a symphonist far from the intrigues and access of the classical music establishment.

TALK: JENNY LIND, NATIONAL TREASURE

Soprano April Fredrick and researcher-librettist Michèle Lammas from Hatpin Productions CIC, a non-profit arts organisation in Worcestershire, are hosting a workshop on 'Jenny Lind: For One Night Only'.

On the 2nd of February 1849, the 'Swedish Nightingale' Jenny Lind performed with other notable artists at College Hall, Worcester, to raise funds for charity. The event was a great success, with proceeds benefiting the local infirmary.

On the 2nd of February 2024, Hatpin Productions commemorated the 175th anniversary of this event. They created a special performance at the Jenny Lind Chapel, in the infirmary building on the University of Worcester's city campus, which was featured on BBC Hereford and Worcester radio, BBC Breakfast news and ITV evening news. The Elgar Festival has invited the group to re-enact this historic anniversary event as part of the festival celebrations.

The talk at The Firs will include a performance by April Fredrick of a beloved Bellini aria previously sung by Jenny Lind; *Qui la voce sua soave*, accompanied by guest violinist Grace Shepherd. Music and heritage learning specialist Sue Pope and aspiring archivist Cat Lammas from the project's creative team will be providing a period costume try-on corner, a garden treasure hunt and an art table, with support from the University of Worcester and volunteers.

Our annual celebration of the unique and glorious tradition of British music for string orchestra, heard in the magnificent acoustic of Worcester Guildhall. Elgar's lone String Quartet is a powerful example of Elgar's mastery of the chamber music idiom, and his deep reverence for this most revered genre, particularly the legacy of Beethoven's late string quartets. This version of the Quartet in its arrangement for full string orchestra was heard at the inaugural Elgar Festival when David Matthews was the featured composer and has since been recorded by the English String Orchestra to international acclaim.

Imogen Holst's Variations are a beautiful addition to the string orchestra repertoire, but also a poignant example of what might have been had the talented female composers of her generation been given greater opportunities and encouragement.

While composers like Steve Elcock, David Matthews and their contemporaries have drawn international acclaim for the way in which they and their peers have reinvigorated the symphony as a genre, Elcock's Concerto Grosso, heard here in the world premiere of the final/revised version, shows Elcock's ability to bring fresh vision, humour, mischief and profundity to other ancient musical forms. Elcock's Concerto Grosso also offers an exceptional showcase for the talents of the ESO's principal players.

Club Elgar events have become a staple of our 'Elgar for Everyone' ethos and this evening's show is no exception as we welcome back the hugely successful and highly versatile violinist and Festival Artist-in-Residence Esther Abrami for her second appearance here this week.

Esther's new album, *Cinéma*, was released in September 2023 on Sony Classical. With a captivating collection of lush new arrangements for violin and orchestra of film and TV scores, classical music from the movies, anime hits and new compositions by Oscarwinning composers, *Cinéma* showcases Esther Abrami's versatility, musical sensitivity and technical mastery, performed here with intimate stripped-down arrangements for violin, piano and string quartet.

Esther carefully curated each piece on the album, noting:

'I am so thrilled about my new album. I wanted to curate a diverse collection that reflects my classical background, my French and Jewish heritage, my support of women in music, the films and anime that moved me the most and to offer a rich tapestry of music that spans genres, cultures and generations. I often reflect on the similarities between film music and classical music – the intricacy of the orchestral arrangements, the emotional depth, and the timeless beauty of both – and I hope that listeners will fall for the music of 'Cinéma' just as I have.'



Elgar's Violin Concerto is unique in its epic scope, virtuosic demands and emotional range. Composed at the height of his formidable musical powers and at the peak of his international fame, Elgar's Violin Concerto is a work both intimate and grandiose, universal and personal, confessional yet private. Throughout his career, Elgar often found inspiration in the unattainable attractions of various muses. None of these 'might have been' loves seems to have affected him as much as the woman he called "Windflower", who inspired this greatest of all violin concertos. In a festival which celebrates the 'Origins of Inspiration', surely love lost or unfilled has inspired more great music than anything else in the human condition.

Steve Elcock owes a degree of his late-in-life success as a composer to a midi mock-up made in 2014 of his epic tone poem, Wreck, which the English Symphony Orchestra finally premiered in Malvern Theatres in 2022. When critic Martin Anderson, owner of Toccata Classics, heard the work for the first time he called it, simply 'some of the best orchestral music by a British composer in the last fifty years.'

Sunday's evensong brings together two composers whose music has had a profound impact on Worcester cathedral throughout the ages: Thomas Tomkins (1572 - 1656) who was organist of Worcester Cathedral for 50 years wrote some of the best church music of the late Tudor, early Stuart period and of course Edward Elgar. Elgar said, 'if you want to hear how my music should sound, you should come to Worcester Cathedral.

The Spirit of the Lord is the opening chorus from the oratorio *The Apostles* written for the 1903 Birmingham Music Festival. Elgar's publishers saw its potential as a stand-alone anthem and as a result it has become a favourite of cathedral choirs.

We also celebrate the 100th anniversary of the death of Charles Villiers Stanford in 2024. His *Canticles in B flat* were written in 1879 while he was organist of Trinity College, Cambridge and have remained on the music lists of all cathedrals and parish choirs since its publication in 1902.

Elgar's *Ave Verum* will be sung during the annual wreath-laying at the Elgar memorial window, bringing the 2024 Elgar Festival to a close.


